LIVES HEALED

COUNSELING SERVICES

Hope and healing for children adults who have experienced childhood abuse. Using proven and effective trauma counseling models, the service supports a holistic family centered approach to healing all ages from children through adults.

- Served 406 children and adults through therapeutic services and provided 3,674 individual counseling sessions
- 89% of children completing individual counseling decreased their trauma symptoms
- 88% of children completing services improved their coping skills

CHILDREN EDUCATED

KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Gives children and teachers the tools they need to recognize and report child abuse and bullying. Using life-size puppets, the program educates children about different types of child abuse, strategies to make schools safer and how to talk to their safe, trusted adults.

- Educated 7,573 children and 617 adults through 103 performances
- 98% of adults viewing the performance found the program helpful to children
- 90% of children increased or maintained their awareness of child abuse and bullying


ADULTS ACT STEWARDS OF CHILDREN

Evidence-based curriculum training designed to educate adults on ways to prevent, recognize and respond responsibly to child sexual abuse.

Provided training to 439 adults
77% of participants understand more about agencies and organizations that can support victims and their families
93% of participants planned to talk to another adult about tools to prevent child sexual abuse

FAMILIES COMMUNICATE NURTURING PARENTING PROGRAM AND PARENTING ENRICHMENT SERVICES

Teaches parents to adapt their attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors about parenting. Programs use family-based curricula that are proven to reduce child abuse and neglect, and improve healthy family function.

- 377 children and adults participated in parenting groups or individual parent coaching. 6,446 hours of service
- 83% of parents reported an increase in ability to support their child's
- development milestones
- 81% of parents showed a reduction in risk for abuse, neglect, and exploitation

PARENTING TIME VISITATION

Creating safe interactions between children and their parents or other caregivers.

- Provided 10,622 facilitated visitations bringing together 708
- children and parents/caregivers
- 77% of active participants demonstrated progress in one or more parenting areas

MOTIVATION

WE STRIVETO BE A PLACE WHEREFAMILIES FEEL SAFE.

Jenny^{*} and her children found some very special things at Family Nurturing Center: healing, hope, safety, strength. Their journey took them from a place of fear and worry to a warm nurturing environment and hope for the future.

"Family Nurturing Center is the only place where I feel safe", Jenny said. "It's a place I know my kids and myself can come to where we are treated with kindness and respect and everyone is here to support us."

Jenny and her children came to Family Nurturing Center after experiencing unspeakable trauma that left them feeling confused, afraid and uncertain. They turned to Family Nurturing Center in search of support, healing and a desire to move forward. Family Nurturing Center staff provided a place and space for Jenny and her children to deal with the trauma that brought them here. Trained therapists helped them learn to identify and express their feelings, learn new skills and build resiliency. With the support of specialized staff, evidencebased interventions and a trauma-informed environment, Jenny and her children are learning to heal together.

Through counseling, parenting and holistic activities, their growth as a family unit has been truly remarkable. Jenny says, "We're in a much better place now even though we still have room to grow. Family Nurturing Center helped us find a brighter future, and now I get to watch my kids grow up and thrive."
